

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

Be it known that we, the subscribers, do hereby associate ourselves as a body politic and corporate pursuant to the statute law of the State of Connecticut regulating the formation and organization of corporation without capital stock and the following are the articles of association:

ARTICLE 1. The name of such corporation shall be Oak Grove Beach Association, Inc.

ARTICLE 2. The purpose for which said corporation is formed are the following, to wit:

1. To provide for the improvement of the beach and waters in the area, and to regulate the use thereof for all purposes.
2. To acquire property in the area including beach property and rights of way, and to hold same for the common and mutual interest and benefit of the property owners and members of this association.
3. To provide for the health, comfort, and convenience of those entitled to the use of the beach area.
4. To regulate travel over and parking on the highways and roads within the area.
5. To keep the streets and roads and all beaches and public places free from disorder and unnecessary noises.
6. To prevent the deposit upon or over any beach or into the waters adjacent thereto of any sewage, refuse, garbage or waste which may endanger the health, safety or comfort of those entitled to the use of the beach.
7. To do all that may be necessary to enhance the beauty of the area and the health, comfort, safety and welfare of the inhabitants thereof.

ARTICLE 3. The said corporation is located in the Town of East Lyme, County of New London, and the State of Connecticut, and the name of the agent whom process may be served is William F. Saars, Manwaring Road, Niantic, Conn.
